FROM THE TRACTOR CAB

Watching the birds following the plough is always interesting, this year is the first time I've noticed a change. Usually the gulls, starlings and jackdaws follow behind the plough landing feeding and catch the plough again in a rolling action. The pied wagtails just keep walking forward as the plough passes. However, this year the Buzzards have joined in and instead of a continuous line of gulls behind the plough, there are gaps as where there is a Buzzard, no gull or other bird will land within 15 feet either side of one. Bats are the only true flying mammal. They sleep hanging upside down navigate by echolocation. The UK is home to 18 species. Most hibernate in the colder months as their diet is insects and very few fly during winter. They hibernate in tiny crevices, probably starting in November and they can drop their heartbeats to 4 a minute, which is some drop as it's about 1000 a minute whilst flying. Don't forget to feed the birds particularly at this time of year.

HOMERSFIELD WOOD

Since we last wrote there have been two wood working parties in September and October. The October wood working party was well attended and it was brilliant working alongside others to maintain and enhance our woodland habitat. Mark Timms, our Tree Warden, has created a plan for us, for which we are most grateful. He has applied for some free trees (Oak, Hornbeam, Cherry and Crab Apple) through the Queen's Green Canopy project and some free hazel plants to boost the shrub layer of the wood. Mark has surveyed the existing trees, noting which ones need to be pruned or cut down due to disease. If you would like to get involved with helping in Homersfield Wood, please keep an eye on the notice board to see when working parties are happening. There will have been one on Saturday November 20th (10am-12pm), there may need to be one in December if the trees arrive at that time (date will be posted on the noticeboard) and then there will be one on Saturday January 22nd 2022 (10am-12pm).

"The village sign on the turn off from the Flixton Road junction has been smashed into several parts and damaged. The village name is now detached from the metal posts and the two metal posts are knocked out of the ground despite huge lumps of concrete weighing them down and ensuring they would stay upright in gales etc. But not against a car at high velocity which has now left behind its blue front bumper and black radiator grill and other black pieces of plastic as well as deep groves in the grass verge which end with the major bits of car. This all happened on Monday 8th November and it may have been spotted by someone but possibly not.

The other sad thing is litter, sometimes from recycling or rubbish bin days when some people use thin plastic sacks which can be torn open by cats, dogs and birds for the possible food remnants inside. Work has begun on the Canser, the footpath from The Street near St James Lane to The Church, to clear out leaves and debris accumulated over the years and improve the surface. ORCHARD REPORT

Maintenance of the orchard has continued during the pandemic and included repairs to the entrance gates as well as the on-going grass cutting and tree pruning. All the trees now have new and, hopefully, deer-proof tree guards. The weather as usual has played its part in the production of fruit with some trees producing bumper crops and others hardly any. Sadly, a further 4 trees have been lost either through adverse weather conditions or damage. It is hoped that replacements will be planted by the spring.

The pandemic also resulted in the loss of Harleston Cider. This left us with the dilemma of what to do with all the fruit – leaving it to rot on or under the trees was not an option!

Eventually, in both 2020 and 2021, apart from fruit picked by the village, most of it was donated to the Food Larder in Halesworth, a project run jointly by the Halesworth Volunteer Centre and St Mary's Church to provide the elderly and families in need with food. The project operates from the Church Hall and people can either donate, take or take and donate, no questions asked and anyone can participate. The fruit from our orchard was used in several ways, as fresh fruit, made into chutney or apple pies and crumbles by volunteers and distributed to the house-bound and isolated, or in the Food Larder.

However, we hope that in the future it will be possible to find another juicer or cider maker so the orchard will be able to obtain a small income again.

Grateful thanks are extended to Richard and Ed Hadingham for all their support, to our pruning and picking volunteers from the village to those from outside St James who are strong orchard supporters, particularly Sarah Day from Homersfield and Jeremy Henry from Rumburgh, and those who continue to enjoy the orchard as a place of quiet relaxation.


