Although the machine is on, the ground they are standing on has no moisture in it and when they touch the fence they do not complete the circuit, we had the same trouble in 1976. Whilst hitching the front of the combine on, a nearly white bird landed not 6 foot a way, where it kept leaping up and down on a piece of cardboard, this carried on for a minute or 2, which is when this young Buzzard realised there was little nourishment in cardboard. Later as the combine and baler were working it descended onto a bale and from this vantage point dropped down on several disturbed rodents, as the baler moved across the field the buzzard moved to, flying from bale to bale. Sadly the martins, swifts and swallows have gone on their long trek to Africa. The geese and ducks can be seen at dusk and dawn migrating across the sky. The hedges are full of berries well the brambles are, but like the sloes, they are small because of the drought. Even in the garden plants, such as runner beans, have not been very prolific as although they are watered and flowering, the petals just fall off, as they struggle with the heat. Many of the birds have successfully reared more than 1 brood.




