FLIXTON DRAINAGE

Touch wood, it seems that the drain cleaning work carried out in The Street has paid dividends. Despite quite a few heavy downpours, flooding outside The Buck has been minimal to almost non-existent. A vast difference after at least 10 years of the unofficial "ford" in the road. Next stop Abbey Road and the underground gully in Church Road.

I took another look in Abbey Road near the farmhouse and it may well be that there is a mix of problems. The moat being overgrown, but also its banks toward the roadside may have eroded, allowing excess water to overspill along the concrete track. We just need to find a landowner and then have a good look.

As for the dyke, there apparently is "something afoot" to get it into a reasonable state of affairs. Residents will have noticed the increased level of settled rainwater due to too much vegetation sitting in the streambed.
