# THE STREET, THE LAST STRAW.

For a few weeks in May traffic through The Street was very restricted due to repair work being carried out on the main road drains It was a period of relative peace but also intermittent disruption as the traffic was reduced, but almost every evening some drivers obviously felt that kicking barriers aside or moving them off the carriageway was perfectly ok. But the disruption and costly repairs would never have been necessary if Suffolk County Council had carried out planned, regular cleaning. Since we've lived in Flixton (over 30 years), the drains had never been properly maintained and had spent much of that time buried completely in grass verge. I'd often dug the drain lids out so they would be visible to Suffolk County Council representatives when they visited but to no avail. Following the bad flooding a couple of winters back, I managed to get SCC to focus their attention on this part of the village. The result is that The Street now has a repaired functioning road drain system able to deal with heavy rain. Yet without some ongoing "policing" by SCC the problem will resurface and may well still exist at the junction of Church Road and The Street. In the past, trailers loaded with straw rarely travelled more than a couple of miles and usually at a pretty slow pace, so loose straw wasn't an issue. Now there are often double loads drawn by lorries or much larger tractors at considerably higher speeds. In addition, fuel for the nearby biomass power station is transported in a similar manner on numerous overloaded bulk trailers. Almost invariably, no loads are covered, leaving residents and our road drains to suffer the consequence of this poor practice. Just this week, as volunteers carried out pathway cleaning, the result of this antisocial behaviour was once again clearly visible with straw everywhere including in the road drains. Local farmers and contractors working for them need to consider their neighbours. And the local authorities need to apply their legal powers if necessary to deal with this relatively new problem. The cause is poor load management. The effect is unnecessary road flooding, unnecessary public purse expenditure to repair drains and scruffy streets.

### THANK YOU 2 SISTERS




