#### 5. CHAIR'S END OF YEAR REPORT 2025 - THREE SAINTS PARISH COUNCIL

This past year has been productive for Three Saints Parish Council with several notable developments and ongoing efforts that aim to benefit our communities.

We took the decision to change the Council's bank account to ensure a better return on the funds held in the account. This was a necessary move in light of increasing financial responsibilities and the need to maximise value for money.

The Clerk has now moved to an official gov.uk email address and website domain. This improves professionalism and brings us into line with national recommendations for parish councils.

We awarded a number of small grants this year in support of local and regional causes. These included:

- South Elmham Community News, to help keep the parish newsletter in circulation
- Bungay & District Royal British Legion, instead of purchasing a poppy wreath, we made a direct donation
- East Anglian Air Ambulance (EAAA), a vital service that benefits everyone across our area

On the practical side, our Handyman carried out excellent work cleaning and re-staining all four village benches. The results have been well received by parishioners.

Mr Barry Lugo continues to provide an excellent service maintaining the grounds at All Saints bus shelter. His work is consistently high quality and much appreciated.

Cllrs organised a spring litter pick, which turned out to be a very cold day and a few local residents joined Councillors to help tidy the parish.

The Council agreed to spend the Transparency Grant to replace the Clerk's laptop, which had become outdated, she can meet legal obligations more efficiently and securely.

We are currently investigating unlawful encroachments onto the commons. This is a serious matter and we are taking legal advice to protect these public spaces for the benefit of future generations and local wildlife.

In June, the Council organised a successful community event to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day. Held at All Saints bus shelter, the event included a barbecue and was well attended. Many thanks to all who came and contributed. We are now planning a further event later in the year to mark VE/VJ Day.

I would like to thank the Clerk for her hard work throughout the year. Thanks also go to all the TSPC's Councillors, who give their time freely for the benefit of the community and many thanks to County Councillor Judy Cloke and District Councillor Anthony Speca for all their support

# 9.a) Annual Report 2024-5 for All Saints

This year has again seen some physical improvements to amenities, some joint activities and a celebration. Issues raised by parishioners, such as potholes, parking and brambles were addressed.

#### **All Saints Shelter Area**

- It was decided to refer to the All Saint's bus shelter as the village or All Saints Shelter as it is now used for a variety of purpose and there are no buses. The area continues to be mown and kept tidy by a parishioner, which is helped by a small Maintenance Grant. The bench was refurbished.
- An A3 laminated version of the 'Walking the Three Saints Footpath Map' was produced and mounted in the Shelter on the village noticeboard. The map was specially designed to include a 'you are here' feature. It was also updated with a sketch of the shelter. The supply of paper copies (1500) was exhausted by the end of the 24/5 year so the poster version in the Shelter is very useful.

#### **All Saints Common**

- Wild flowers are slowly increasing, notably with cowslips, primroses, yellow rattle and very small numbers of pyramidal and green-winged orchids. Cutting of the Common was timed to respect the wildflower season. Owners of Mill Farm were given permission to cut back the hedge and clear brambles etc round the pond (mardle) and this carried out.
- Some potholes were repaired and visibility on the corner near the Grange was improved. The heavy traffic using the lanes causes considerable wear and tear on the roads.
- Parking of cars on the Common is sometimes a problem.

Around 50 parishioners and friends gathered to mark D-Day 80, entertained by a piper, with barbecue, food and drink. The 'Walking the Three Saints Footpath Map' was officially launched at the event.

#### 9.c) Annual Report: Matters Relating to St Peters

Community spirit and "sense of place" remains high in St Peters. Communal events in 2024-25 included a plant and bric a brac sale organised by Pam Bonnett with proceeds (£830) benefiting the parish church; a summer barbecue hosted by Carol and Tim Maycock; Christmas dinner at St Peter's Hall; and in July, the annual boules tournament.

The latter event celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> year and is held at Ilketshall St Andrew's village hall, as with 20 teams competing it has outgrown its original home at St Peter's Brewery. Proceeds in excess of £1000 were raised for the parish church during a competitive but convivial day of bouling. Many thanks are owed to Tim and Carol Maycock, Pam Bonnett, David and Linda Humphreys and many other residents who work hard to make this event such a success.

Residents participated in the Three Saints' litter picks and attended the D Day commemorations organised by the parish council.

Daily life in the village continues to be frustrated by the state of the local roads. Potholes and badly damaged verges caused by the ever-increasing numbers of heavy vehicles and the sheer size of agricultural equipment, significantly compromise the use of our roads especially by cyclists, equestrians and pedestrians. Harvesting of sugar beet in wet winter weather causes particularly dangerous conditions for local road users and is a cause of significant local frustration.
