



FLIXTON NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING UPDATE

The annual parish meeting was held at the village hall on Tuesday, 15th April. A summary report of the previous year was presented by Phillip Kidner, the Group Parish Council Chairman and further local village information was presented by Ken Warne, Flixton Parish Council's Chairman. Issues regarding training for use of power tools, eg a strimmer, were ongoing with SCC representatives and this was limiting the things which the Community Self Help Group could achieve. The parking problem in St Felix Rise is still being dealt with by the District Council which is aiming to reorganise the parking area where the rented garages are currently based. Although the poor condition of Grange Road had been accepted as an issue, SCC have said

they don't have the finances to address the problem which is caused by HGVs trying to pass each other. The proposed Solar Farm was discussed and how it might affect the village. The public consultation exhibition was due to be held on 16th April. It was agreed that the subject would be added to the Group Parish Annual General Meeting planned for early May.

SOLAR FARM CONSULTATION

While the proposal for a solar farm does not seem to have been received with shock and people are generally supportive of the principle, it has definitely generated a great deal of interest. The problem with a consultation exhibition is that the opportunity to clarify key points and to allay fears can easily drift into generating feelings of doubt and concern. Over many years Flixton has suffered extraordinary disruption for such a small village while gaining little or no benefit for the community, so there is a natural distrust of most things "new" and particularly when questions aren't actually answered by bill board displays and still more questions are often generated. Sadly, this appeared to be the case at the consultation exhibition in the village hall on 16th April. The problem now is, given the timescale from the proposal through to work commencing, there is little available time to address concerns and provide clear information. An opportunity has been missed. Let's hope that the presenters understood that more clear information is needed and that they keep the community advised. There seem to be some questions which would be easy to answer; how and where does the farm connect to the grid? What is the detail regarding funding available to support the local community? How can a public footpath cross within the boundary of the farm when energy security is such a key issue? Let's hope these answers arrive soon.

Most people will know by now that The Buck has closed its doors, for now. Following the tragic death of Ben Doughty, his family initially had to struggle in order to open the pub within the timescales Ben had been chasing. Then for over three years they worked at keeping a very large establishment viable, providing local employment and also taking care of their own parents/grandparents at the closing years of their lives. So, all that effort takes its toll and in April, Linda and Gary decided that they needed time for their own lives. The Buck is large hospitality building sitting within a

We are glad that they continue to support the village in various ways. We welcomed Lynne in May 2024 and Peter in March 2025. We are most appreciative that Tony and Helen allow us to hold our meetings in the Black Swan.

CHURCH WOOD - In August we held an extra meeting to enable us to focus on making plans for Church Wood. The wood has been inspected for safety and tree surgeon work completed. Mark has organised 8 volunteer mornings - clearing brambles, pathways and planting replacement trees. A volunteer from the village has also worked extremely hard to clear the brambles outside of the organised mornings. We are moving forward with the new welcome board.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS - We have discussed six planning applications and the article 4 direction.

HOMERSFIELD PLAYING FIELD - Homersfield Community Park Charity have continued to work to re-open the Playing Field using funds from a bequeathment. The bequeathment conditions include that the charity owns the Playing Field. It has been valued and the transfer of ownership from Homersfield Parish Council to the Charity begun. Homersfield Parish Council will continue to support the charity to keep this valuable village resource open and usable.

WEBSITE DOMAIN - Following guidance, we now have a gov.uk website and a clerk's mailbox.

SOUTH NORFOLK TRACTOR RUN - In February, over 50 tractors stopped at Homersfield raising money for a Cancer charity. 


