Watching the cattle grazing, suddenly a partridge flew from under the grazing animal's nose to land on its back where it sunk its claws into the bewildered beast which shot backwards, the partridge took off only to land on the beasts back again before gliding back down to earth. 

There was a good deal of enthusiastic input and energy for events. Much of the previous events were organised by the Village Hall Committee which possibly put too much work on their shoulders, so the idea of a small group with links to the village facilities might help. Several ideas and themes for get togethers were discussed and Lin took these away to work out how things could be progressed. If anyone is keen to be a part of a network of residents organising social activities, please let me know.

#### ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The APM was very well attended, the main area of discussion being the age old issues of speeding and also HGV volume.

Where speeding issues related to the Poultry Plant, the local site manager had produced an information board for the attention of the plant employees. Ken Warne informed the meeting that the local site manager seemed keen to ensure a good relationship with the village.

Regarding speed management through the village, Ken gave various options discussed with Suffolk Highways. All had their own positive and negative points. However, regarding the cost of any of the options it had been made pretty clear that funding would have to come from village and not from any Highways budget. Brian Beales, representing the local quarry made the offer of materiel assistance should it be needed. Road width along The Street was discussed, including the fact that HGVs were mounting the pavement in order to pass each other. Some thought that the hedge opposite the path caused the problem. The real cause is the carriageway is too narrow.

For information there is a recent government planning document titled (I believe) Manual for Streets which gives guidance for traffic mainly in 30mph areas. Whilst some diagrams show two HGVs passing in a 5.5 metre width carriageway, there are others showing the vehicle width, mirror to mirror, as 3 metres. Clearly then, The Street carriageway, at 5.4 metres is at least 0.6 metres too narrow.

There was some discussion regarding having a working team of volunteers to clean up the pavement in order to make it wider and safer. The village Community Speed Watch group now has its minimum required number of volunteers, after much struggling to get interest,

We will be needing quite a lot of vegetation to feed our ever-expanding rabbit population, including the legendary Black Rabbit of Beckford.

The main talking point over this period has been the diversionary route for 2 Sisters traffic through our area whilst road repairs were carried out on Grange Road at Flixton.

It is not clear whether no one really assessed to levels of damage that would be caused to the roads and verges by driving that volume of heavy traffic on two directional roads not much wider than the vehicles themselves, or whether they did make that assessment and didn't care. Having made a poor decision, they doubled down by refusing to engage in a meaningful way with local people or consider alternatives. As a result, roads that became dangerous to use were kept open at all costs and despite assurances have yet to be repaired apart from a few cosmetic patches. Verges, important for biodiversity where orchids primroses and cowslips grow have been churned and the road artificially widened. These should be reinstated but I suspect they will now just be tarmacked over and become part of the road. So much for all the fancy environmental policies. The little dirt pull ins, useful as passing places for motorists and cyclists are to a large part no longer usable. We await developments with interest.

Back to happier subjects, the 49 club was won in April by Louise and in May by Gemma. Numbers are still available if you would like to play with the proceeds going to the church. Please speak to Pamela.




