FROM THE TRACTOR SEAT



Whilst combining, looking down into the crop, you see round areas of flattened crop where the deer have been laying. The swifts have mostly gone back to Africa, whilst the swallows will be here a little longer. Following the plough (see cover) feasting on the worms and other food brought up by the plough, are the seagulls in their many different sizes and shades. In attendance although not in so many numbers are starlings, rooks and jackdaws. Although the seagulls follow the plough, the others just move across the furrows. The starlings fly in the best RAF precision staying the same distance from each other and should you be lucky enough to see a large murmuration, with thousands of these birds swirling in the air, twisting and turning without hitting each other, it is amazing. Sometimes the pied wagtails turn up bobbing up and down whilst feeding. Usually a buzzard is not far away, then the other birds keep their

distance, although I did witness a young one take a rat, this was a bit heavy and they could not get more than a couple of feet off the ground, so it was dropped, the bird then landed and came back. The jackdaws are a bit more likely to do aerial acrobatics than their relations rooks and crows. Only today one appeared to free fall spiralling downwards before pulling up just before hitting the ground. As the Beck dried up the heron arrived to fish out the last few puddles, also the little egret who was a resident, but hasn't been seen until now.

FLIXTON NEWS

VILLAGE MEETING

So, the next meeting is on 26th September at 7.00pm in the Adair Room at the Buck, thanks to Linda and Gary for providing the venue, free of charge. Obviously there'll be some updates on training for Community Support Group members, important to ensure that community "work" is kept as safe as possible for the small army (ok, platoon) of volunteers who always show up to help improve our village

As I wrote in the last Community News, tidying up the area around and behind the old telephone kiosk may be another task to consider at the next Village Meeting.

Regarding flooding, we are now reaching the time when the potential for flooding may increase, so we may have to consider contingency options if the Environment Agency do not complete their work. The dyke along The Street is well overgrown and there is some concern that the vegetation will eventually collapse into the stream, raising the height of the riverbed. Latest feedback is that the Environment Agency intend clearing the dyke this coming Autumn. Just as importantly, we have to consider what can be done to clean/clear the culvert along Church Road and to check out all road drains after the latest influx of "flying straw". The flooding which occurred a couple of winters ago in Church Road and The Street was the direct result of neglect by Environment Agency and Suffolk County Council made worse by a cavalier approach by some road haulers and farming contractors not covering their loads.

NEW LOOK for the village! If you haven't seen them already, make sure you check out the progress in refurbishing our telephone kiosk and water pump in front of the Hall. This is the result of several people putting in a lot of voluntary effort to enhance the look of our village. We are especially grateful to Joseph Thurston, who spent hours removing old and broken glass, putty and fittings from the kiosk ready for sandblasting and the proper red paint. The old parish pump has had a refresh and is no long a rusty monument but now smart in green. Whilst at it, our post box was also given the treatment.

NORFOLK & SUFFOLK AVIATION MUSEUM

Since our last article printed in the Newsletter progress has been made with respect to additional land we purchased adjacent to the existing site. Our museum's roots can be traced back 52 years to a handful of aviation enthusiasts, meeting in an old Nissen hut behind the Flixton Post Office. From those inauspicious beginnings, our museum has grown into a widely appreciated aviation attraction, now bringing in over 21000 visitors per year.

We have contracted a planning consultant to assist us through the process of developing the site. There are various things that we hope to achieve as part of this process.


The section of woodland that we now own is set to become our primary car park through access just inside our existing land. This will enable us to increase car parking spaces which can get very full-on busy days. The section of meadow that we purchased adjacent to the existing site will continue to act as overflow car parking (which through the kindness of Andrew and Emma Gilham the museum has enjoyed for some time). We also seek permission to create an exit from the site and a new car park which will allow safer access to the road as well as a one-way system that does not have cars driving through the main site where visitors are viewing the main outside aircraft display

We will also be placing one of our aircraft sections on the meadow by the road as an eye-catching advert for the museum. We do not believe that this will impinge on the village.

The existing land will continue to provide blue badge and volunteer parking.

There are other developments that we are seeking to accomplish too. We plan to erect a new building on the South side of our existing site. This will then form the entrance and exit from our site to/from the new car park. It will also house the shop and NAAFI (café). The reason for needing an entrance/exit will become obvious later in this article.

The next plan is to erect a new workshop. We have always been very lucky to have skilled craftsmen and women volunteering at the museum and having a purpose-built workshop for them is important.

Aircraft were not designed to be stored outside for lengthy periods of time and would benefit greatly and last FAR longer if they were displayed inside. To that end, we seek to build a new Hangar on the north side of the site. This building will allow us to move another six or seven aircraft inside. Moving the NAAFI into the new entrance building will allow another aircraft to move inside.

Our final building project is that we seek to expand our current flight simulator building to house a new simulator.

None of these buildings will be easily visible from the road through the village, nor will the new car park, so we believe that the various projects will have no negative impact on the village.

In all the years we have been open as a museum, we have never charged for admission. But, as we have grown, the demands have also grown. We need to maintain our ageing collection; we need to add to the attractions for our visitors; and, in keeping with the museum's history of expansion, we have more plans for expansion over the next five years, as explained earlier in this article.

Despite not charging admission, the museum has never been 'free'. We have always said that we rely on donations. Originally, we asked that visitors donated what they could afford. Latterly we asked that visitors donated what they thought we were worth.



However, the average donation per visitor stands at £1.83 and the reality is, we cannot maintain our museum, much less improve it, for £1.83 per visitor!

And so, to ensure an exciting and bright future for NASAM, we have taken the decision that, from the beginning of 2025, we will start to charge an admission fee. We have taken our cue from other comparable museums and have set our prices accordingly. We are currently one of only two aviation museums in Britain that do not charge admission. The prices will be:

- Adult £10.00
- Child (over 5) £5.00
- Family (up to 2 adults, up to 3 children) £20

We have always valued the patronage of local people and appreciate the support you have given us over the years. We recognise that, unlike many of our visitors, you're not necessarily going to spend all day with us on your frequent visits. This had some bearing on our deciding to opt for a ticket valid for 12 months.

We trust that, if you are one of our many repeat visitors, you won't feel that £10 per person is an unreasonable ask for unlimited visits over a 12-month period.
